Proclamation

Whereas:

Every year thousands of American workers are killed by workplace injuries and occupational disease; and

WHEREAS: Thirty-nine years ago, Congress passed the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) promising every worker the right to a safe job in the United States; and

WHEREAS: The toll of workplace injuries, illnesses and death remains enormous; and

WHEREAS: Concerned Americans are determined to prevent these tragedies by:

Observing Workers' Memorial day on April 28, as a day to remember these victims of workplace injuries and disease;

Renewing our efforts to seek stronger safety and health protections, better standards and enforcement, and fair and just compensation;

Rededicating ourselves to improving safety and health in every American workplace.

NOW THEREFORE: I, David J. Berger, Mayor of the City of Lima, Ohio, do hereby proclaim April 28th as

WORKERS' MEMORIAL DAY

in Lima, Ohio, in recognition of workers killed, injured and disabled on the job.
