Group #6 - Mayors, Chiefs, Sheriff Associations, Officers: Improve customer relations by becoming more involved in community affairs

Agency administrations, Individual officers & deputies, media, publicly invite officers & deputies to meetings, Social, civic & religious groups.

Group #6 - Mayors, Chiefs, Sheriff Associations, Officers: Adequate resources for change (funds & personnel)

City Council, County Commissioners, Grant Writing, Agency Administrations.

Group #8 - Allen County Officials, Lima Chamber, School Board: Return to the community policing concept

Group #8 - Allen County Officials, Lima Chamber, School Board: Equip officers with training & materials to solve problems in order to be proactive

Group #8 - Allen County Officials, Lima Chamber, School Board: Law enforcement officers should participate in community activities more, including sponsorship, ownership & partnership. Avoid the "them vs. us" syndrome.

Group #8 - Allen County Officials, Lima Chamber, School Board: Approach each situation without stereotyping. Avoid racial profiling and include council advise and mentorship

Group #8 - Allen County Officials, Lima Chamber, School Board: Law Enforcement exec & officers should be trained in public relations and their impact on economic development

Group #9 - Court, Parole, Juvenile: Law Enforcement should go back to community policing model

Group #9 - Court, Parole, Juvenile: Law enforcement needs to exemplify the model "protect & serve"

Group #9 - Court, Parole, Juvenile: Law Enforcement officers should not abuse power. Treat people the way they themselves would want to be treated. Do things because you should do them, not because you can do them.

Group #10 - Citizens, Child Protective Services: Increase communication and trust between law enforcement and citizens

Group #11 - Senior Citizens, Care Givers: Return to community oriented policing

All police chiefs, Mayor, County Commissioners, City Council, Sheriff, Citizen support, Neighborhood associations.

Group #11 - Senior Citizens, Care Givers: Law enforcement response should be in a timely manner. (emergency response time is slow. Officers should be available during shift change. Review dispatch priorities.

All police chiefs, Sheriff, Dispatch supervisor, Desk officers.

Group #11 - Senior Citizens, Care Givers: Law enforcement personnel should avoid the abuse of power and exercise authority. (Mutual respect to the public.)

Individual officers, Prosecutor, Consultant, All Police Chiefs, Sheriff, Law Director.

Group #12 - Hospital, Fire, Emergency Services: Return to community oriented policing, including school liaison officers
