What You Need to Know About Snow Removal

When the snow falls and ice builds up on sidewalks this winter, remember the requirements for maintaining your sidewalks. You need to clear all sidewalks along your property within 4 hours after the snow or ice stops falling, during daylight hours. "Section 1806.05 of the Property Maintenance Code specifically states that the owner, occupant or any person having the care of any building, lot or land abutting on any street, square or other public way within the City, where there is a sidewalk in front of or alongside of the same, shall, within the first four (4) hours after daylight after snow has ceased to fall, cause such snow to be removed from such sidewalk. The provisions of this section shall also apply to the falling of snow or ice from buildings upon such sidewalks."

Neighborhood Spotlight: City Wide Pride

It is time to start thinking "Spring" and with that comes City Wide Pride. City Wide Pride is the City's largest cleaning event that takes place over 3 weekends in May. Volunteers host dumpster sites in various neighborhoods throughout the city to collect large amounts of trash that has built up over the winter. The city is seeking individuals, service clubs, and neighborhood associations to host dumpsters and help collect trash from residents. The application materials for interested groups will be available on the City of Lima website by the end of February. City Wide Pride will be held May 5, 12, and 19, 2018 from 9:00am to noon. Lima Police Department Gets A Face Lift

Driving by the Lima Police Department, you may have noticed that major renovations are taking place. Investigative Services will move into a new addition attached to the Hall of Justice. This will open up space which is necessary for Lima Municipal Court. The renovations will also provide much needed space for a female locker room which is necessary with the increased number of females hired by the City over the last several years. This locker room is also keeps LPD in conformity with federal regulations. The renovation process will be completed by June of 2018.

In addition to the major building project, the roof is also being redone which will be completed by the end of 2017. In early 2018, there will be an unveiling of the exterior signage wherein the Hall of Justice will be given the new name, Chief William K. Davenport Hall of Justice. The Lima Police Department recently received a new COPS hiring grant which allows for the hiring of 3 additional patrol officers.
